To: Members of Congress and Washington Governor Jay Inslee

Subject: Oppose the Trans Mountain Pipeline Expansion!

I just found out that Canada's National Energy Board gave provisional approval to the Trans Mountain Pipeline expansion proposal and put the American northwest at risk for a catastrophic oil spill. If the Trans Mountain Pipeline is approved, it would triple the barrels of tar sands being transported from Alberta to Burnaby and increase the number of oil tankers in the Salish Sea from one per week to one per day! This is an unacceptable risk to our ecosystem, our community and the people and animals that call this region home. With the precarious condition of the endangered Southern Resident Killer Whale community in the Salish Sea, this increased threat of oil spills must be addressed by both Washington State and the U.S. Congress.

The U.S. needs to tell the Trudeau government in Canada that it opposes the Trans Mountain Pipeline expansion before its final decision in December of this year. The U.S. and Washington State governments have yet to fully engage in the decision-making process, merely commenting on the mitigation measures proposed rather than opposing the massive increase in oil spill and climate risks the tar sands pose.

I am asking you to stand up for the Salish Sea and oppose the expansion of the Trans Mountain Pipeline today!
